The Trustees of Te Awahohonu Forest Trust, managing Tarawera C9 land, are pleased to report the payment of the twenty ninth distribution to owners.

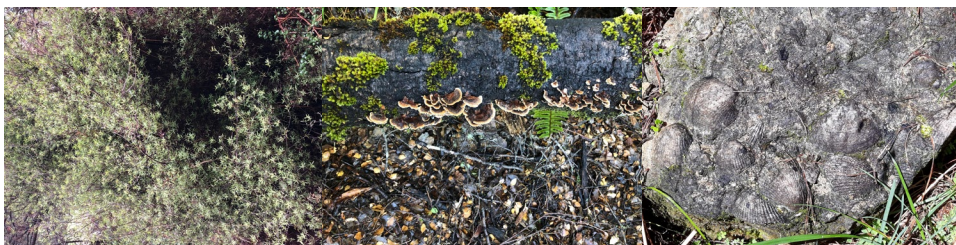
Please ensure you check the information is correct on your dividend statement that will be sent out in November so payment can be made to you in December 2020.
